After the cultural event it was possible to get Indian street food and interact with old friends or meet new people.

The event raised 5965 DKK which is great. We also got a few new members to Friends of Shamayita Math. A warm welcome to you.

One of the leaders of Shamayita Math, Mother Prajnamita has sent a mail with inputs regarding the latest developments. She writes: Shamayita Convent school reopened on 13th June after one month of vacation. Marang Buru schools (the village schools) practically had a very short summer vacation, 30th April to 8th May, 2022. Our teachers of Marang Buru have been putting a great effort to make up for the learning gap due to countrywide lockdown. The West Bengal Government schools have closed early due to the intense summer heat. This provided us the opportunity to hold Marang Buru for longer hours.

In fact, Marang Buru school is held from 6:30 am till 10 am. In the event extended summer vacation in Govt. schools, the parents have immense interest to send their children to Marang Buru schools. Under normal conditions, students return home at 10 am and join government school from 11 am. Since the parents are unable to provide any kind of education support at home, they feel helpless if the schools are closed.

This year we have added another additional class, i.e. Standard V in all the three Marang Buru schools, as the Government high schools now have classes from Std VI to STD XII (initially it was from Std V). The shed constructed in KB Thol school with the fund from Rotary, has provided us the opportunity to conduct the additional class in that shed. When the school ends, the shed acts as a dining shed, where students have their midday meal.

A new filtered drinking water system has been installed in KB Thol school, since the existing water from hand pump had too much of iron. This has added value to the school. After two long years the school is being held with all its scheduled activities mentioned in the calendar.

The Covid pandemic caused disruption to the education system with schools forced to shut down during the lockdown period, and the transition of students and teachers to online teaching-learning. In India, around 250 million students were affected due to school closures at the onset of lockdown induced by COVID-19. The pandemic posed several challenges in public and private schools which included an expected rise in dropouts, learning losses, and increase in digital divide. But since Marang Buru school continued offline mode of teaching from October 2021, we did not face much difficulty. There are no case of drop out, but learning loss is there to some extent due to school closure in 2020. But soon the gap will be made up, as the school is in full swing this year.

In Shamayita Convent School, we are facing a struggle, as there are many cases of drop out. Many students are asking for concession in school fee, all because the father have either lost his job, or incurred a loss in business. We are arranging funds for accommodating such students in our school. The pandemic has made it crystal clear that nothing can substitute schooling. Education is a process of continuous of developing a child's intellectual, mental and emotional quotient. Using classrooms, laboratories, playgrounds will only be capable of installing life skills among the students. But digital platform has facilitated the communication of the parents with the teachers.

Overall things are coming back to normal. But it will take few more years to recover."
